

From the Director. . .

This year's Pleasant Valley Community School District Wall of Honor Distinguished Alumni recipient is Dan Klopp. Dan graduated from PVHS in 1994. Throughout his high school career he was heavily involved He played George Spelvin in An Actor's in drama. Nightmare, a dead theatre critic in The Real Inspector Hound, and he directed The Musical Comedy Murders of Dan also suffered from a severe speech/hearing condition. I'm not sure if "suffered" is the correct verb however. Dan's passion for everything in which he was involved more than compensated for the difficulties he experienced. Dan's work for the marginalized and underprivileged in Peru further exemplifies his passion and the type of man he has become. Not unlike J.B. (our modern Job), Dan's faith withstands trials and tribulations most of us may not even be able to imagine. His conviction, shared by J.B., in the face of incredible challenges is a lesson we could all learn.

Synopsis

Archibald MacLeish's Pulitzer Prize winning verse play sets the Old Testament book of Job in a semi-satirical modern setting (a circus tent), where J.B. (Job) undergoes his trials under the watchful eyes of the circus vendors Zuss and Nickles, who mimic the roles of God and Satan, respectively. J.B.'s plight is essentially a play within a play, as the focus of the work tends to be the interactions between Zuss and Nickles. MacLeish raises the eternal questions through these powerful scenes, most notably with the recurring jingle of Nickles: "If God is God he is not good; if God is good He is not God..." Readers of this play are forced to address the questions themselves while they are entertained and challenged by the proposals of the characters and the Biblical parallels they represent. Setting

The play takes place in the interior of a traveling circus tent which has been touring the back roads of the world for a very long time.




